November 30<sup>th</sup> 2010**

**Introduction of Compulsory Competitor Marshalling Scheme**

**Summary**

- To obtain a 2012 Competition licence, 2011 licence holders are obliged to marshal on a minimum of two events during 2011.
- Aim is to increase the number of available marshals to all clubs next year.
- Many competitors already meet the requirement, this proposal is aimed at the competitors not currently marshalling.
- Plan includes dividing the country into three "marshalling" regions, with obligation to include one event in the competitors home region, and one event in a neighbouring region, thus not affecting any existing arrangements between clubs.
- If passed, the scheme will benefit competitors and organisers, more marshals, especially current and experienced competitors, will mean safer stages for crews and spectators alike.
- Scheme to be administered by MI, with separate sign on sheets for Competitors marshalling on the day, and an obligation on the Competitor to produce their licence at sign on.
- If COC's and/or Chief Marshals of individual events are happy with their marshalling numbers at present, they can opt to remove their events from the list of "qualifying" events, thus making more marshals available to other events.
- Fully detailed Proposal to be circulated to delegates if passed at CAC, for discussion at next monthly Club meetings.
- In order for the scheme to operate for 2012, system must be in place for Galway International 2012, 4/5/6 Feb 2011.
